



Adding additional parties

Beginning December 30, 2022, CM/ECF registered users will be asked for additional party information when filing documents using certain events. The purpose of the additional information is to assist the court in conducting conflict checking and provide docket clarity.

Docketing instruction

When docketing, follow the instruction within each entry as it applies to the filing.

<p>1. For example, within the Motion to compel event, this screen will list multiple parties. Select the party, or select the 'Multiple or not listed' entry to manually enter the parties on the next screen.</p>	 <p>If multiple entities are involved or if the entity is not listed, select Multiple or not listed, enter manually</p> <p>Name of entity being compelled: Multiple or not listed, enter manually ▼</p> <p>Next Clear</p> <p>Creditor One Creditor Two Multiple or not listed, enter manually</p>
<p>2. If the 'Multiple or not listed, enter manually' selection was made, party names will be entered in this box. This will add directly to the docket text as appropriate.</p>	 <p>Name(s) of entity(ies) being compelled: <input type="text"/></p> <p>Next Clear</p>
