NOTICE OF MOTION AND MOTION

TO: THE COURT, UNITED STATES TRUSTEE, THE DEBTORS AND THEIR
ATTORNEY:

1. Dorraine A. Larison, Trustee of the bankruptcy estate of the above-named debtors, moves the court for the relief requested below and gives notice of hearing.

2. The Court will hold a hearing on this motion at 10:30 a.m. on September 29, 2004, in Courtroom No. 7 West, at the United States Courthouse, at 300 South Fourth Street, in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

3. Any response to this motion must be filed and delivered not later than September 22, 2004, which is seven (7) days before the time set for the hearing, or filed and served by mail not later than September 17, 2004, which is ten (10) days before the time set for the hearing. **UNLESS A RESPONSE OPPOSING THE MOTION IS TIMELY FILED, THE COURT MAY GRANT THE MOTION WITHOUT A HEARING.**

4. This Court has jurisdiction over this motion pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334, 11 U.S.C. § 522, Bankruptcy Rule 5005 and 9014, Local Rule 1070-1. This proceeding is a core proceeding. The petition commencing this Chapter 7 case was filed on July 7, 2004. The case is now pending in this Court.

5. This motion arises under 11 U.S.C. § 522, and Bankruptcy Rule 4003 and Local Rule 4003-1(a). This motion is filed under Bankruptcy Rule 9014 and Local Rules 9001-1 to

9001-6 and 9013-1 to 9013-5. Movant requests relief with respect to debtors' claim for exemption.

6. Debtors have claimed as exempt the following asset which the trustee objects to as follows: Computer, monitor, and printer claimed exempt under MSA § 550.37 subd. 6 with a scheduled value of \$300.00.

7. The trustee objects to the debtors' claim of exemption on the following basis: The debtors testified that the computer, monitor, and printer are for home use. The trustee objects to the debtors' claim of exemption for the computer, monitor, and printer because the computer, monitor, and printer are not implements or tools of the trade for either debtor as required under the statute.

WHEREFORE, Applicant moves the court for an order sustaining trustee's objection to claimed exempt property and such other relief as may be just and equitable.
