

On Thursday, August 20, the Bankruptcy Court will upgrade to Version 3.3.2. CM/ECF will be down from 5:00 p.m. Thursday, August 20 until 10:00 a.m. Friday, August 21. The system's search and filing options will not be available during that time.

The primary change in this upgrade relates to the filer's redaction responsibility. The login screen will now include the following language:

IMPORTANT NOTICE OF REDACTION RESPONSIBILITY: All filers must redact: Social Security or taxpayer-identification numbers; dates of birth; names of minor children; and financial account numbers, in compliance with [Fed. R. Bankr. P. 9037](#). This requirement applies to all documents, including attachments.

I understand that, if I file, I must comply with the redaction rules. I have read this notice.

The filer will be able to log in only after agreeing to comply with the redaction rules.

The citations to the rules are hyperlinks which, if clicked, take the filer to the text of the rule, and the filer cannot complete the login process without checking the box on the last line of the message.

In addition, another reminder message has been added to the screen preceding final submission of the filed document. That message says simply, "Have you redacted?" No affirming keystroke is required for that message.

NOTE TO ATTORNEYS USING THIRD-PARTY SOFTWARE. Software vendors have been notified of the change; however, attorneys might want to confirm with their vendor that this change has been incorporated into their software.

In Cases Report, the terminated debtor will only be included in the data if the 'Party information' is included in the selection criteria. If 'Party Information' is not included and Debtor 1 is terminated, only the joint debtor will display. The terminated debtor is no longer part of the Short title of the case, which is what displays when the 'party information' is not selected.
